We really struggled in 2011 with the high amount of very young animals being abandoned on our doorstep kittens as young as 3 days old and puppies at 6 weeks. These poor animals don't

stand a chance without

- someone who can feed, care
- for, and love them.
- We are looking for
- experienced animal lovers to

help with kittens, puppies and

rabbits. The staff can help with some basic teaching but experience is needed.

Foster care can be a lot of work and some very young animals need feeding every 2 hours, day and night, and need constant care, others just need a warm house and some extra cuddles.

These young animals which have had a very poor start can sometimes be very scared and need a few days with a foster parent to be able to trust again. Young animals do 100% better in a warm loving home where they can get 24 hour care and become well socialised. We would love to hear from you if you have the time and knowledge to help us.

Please be aware that a lot of the animals will be scared and upset so a quiet, calm house is best.

Rabbits Happy At Last!

On 14th December 22 rabbits were removed from a home in which they were kept in horrible conditions.

The local RSPCA inspector rang for our help and we agreed to take 10 rabbits in. After the officer had removed all 22 rabbits he rang with very upsetting news that 16 were either already dead or had been put to sleep on veterinary advice..

We took in 6 female very skinny, but very sweet, girls. These 6 girls were kept in a hutch together 2 foot by 2 foot for most of their lives.

They are now in a run 8 foot by 8 foot and can't believe their luck! They enjoy running around and stretching their legs for the first time and eating a good selection of vegetables. They also love a cuddle every day from our head rabbit carer Ann.

We would like to use this terrible incident to raise awareness that rabbits are pets which deserve as much attention as a cat or dog not an animal to be left at the end of the garden and visited once a week as a chore.

They are sociable animals who like other rabbit companionship, or plenty of attention from people.

It is also so important to have your rabbits neutered to stop any unnecessary breeding, resulting in unwanted litters and overcrowded pens.

The problem is getting bigger and for the first time we have been full to our capacity every day this year! If you are considering a pet rabbit or know anyone that is please ask them to visit us and have a look at our 24 rabbits waiting for their forever homes or come for a chat first. Any staff member will be happy to answer any of your questions.



Sleep Well Joey!!!

Joey came to Animal Care on the 6th June 2006. Since then he has lived with us on site. He made lots of friends in his time at Animal Care, two legged and 4 legged. He was loved by all the staff and enjoyed his play time in the paddock.

Joey suffered from epilepsy and was on strong medication for 5 years. He did not let his illness stop him from running round the paddock and if you weren't careful knocking you flying!!

Joey's fits became worse over the last few months and he was clearly suffering.

On the 18th December 2011 Joeys fits were so bad we had no option but to call the vet out. It was with her advice that Joey was put to sleep. Joey had people round him who loved him and he went very peacefully.

Joey will always be remembered in all our hearts and although it's sad he did not find his forever home he was very much at home and happy at Animal Care.

All the staff will miss him dearly. A special thank you to the Rigby's who loved Joey and came to visit him each week to take him on a lovely walk.

Cat Crisis!!

This year Animal Care had over 400 cats and kittens handed in from all over the north west. This year has seen a high increase of cats and kittens being dumped on the doorstep.

- In the first week of October 2011
- five cats were left abandoned in
- boxes by the Animal Care gates
- and one mother and kittens left in
- the rain.



We do all we can to help people on our waiting list as soon as we can but people are running out of options and finding the only thing they can do is to dump the cat and hope we find them.

We are receiving at least 5 phone calls a day from people desperately trying to rehome their cats or report a stray cat in their area. This problem is getting bigger every year. Statistics show there are over Imillion stray cats in the UK.

Money and food for their care is low. We need all the help we can get from anybody who can donate food or money (how ever much) it all helps.

Kittens need special food and this is not cheap but we feel it is important for them to have the best start possible.
