Wildlife Rescue

The storm that hit our area at the end of February left Animal Care with a lot of damage. The hen hut which had 10 ex battery hens in was totally destroyed the roof was ripped off and the whole area was flooded.

In 2013 we rescued over 300 ex battery hens and five cockerels who needed help, all of which were placed in new homes to enjoy the rest of their lives.

Ex battery hens are something we have enjoyed rescuing and find very rewarding to see them recover and start to enjoy a world beyond the Inside of a crowded shed. We are very keen to continue our work saving as many more as possible but need help to build and repair the hen hut. Sadly the hen hut was not the only thing that was damaged, the whole wildlife area took a real battering and tore down most of our aviary's and flooded the whole area making it unusable for any further work we plan to do.

Last year was our busiest year for helping wildlife casualties and showed us that there was a real need for a wildlife area though the busiest months of the year.

We were flat out caring for a huge amount of birds, hedgehogs, rabbits, and ducks but with hard work come massive rewards we managed to save 100s of little lives last year and were looking forward to doing the same this year. The staff work there socks off to try and save as many wildlife casualties as possible. P.T.O
