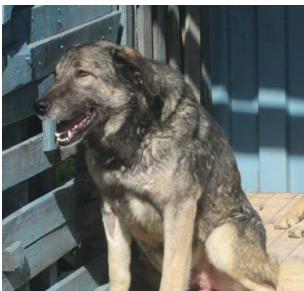
A few months ago Animal Care was asked to take part in a huge rescue mission 71 dogs were only moments away from being brutally killed in a Romanian death camp. The rescue missions aim was to get all 71 dogs out of the horrible filthy death camp and find them all homes or rescues in the UK they were very successful and manage to get every single dog into safety which was a huge and fantastic result. When Animal Care were asked to help we jumped at the chance to give theses dogs the chance of a happy life! We offer spaces for 8 dogs and they traveled over to us with in a few weeks!

Romanian Rescue Mission

All 8 Romanian dogs had obviously been through a terrible time with daily beatings all the dogs were covered in sores they had very little food or water all were very scared and very under weight. The staff got to work straight away and spent hours sitting in the kennels teaching the dogs to trust again, it was not long until they were wagging tails and coming over for hugs. 3 have already been placed into homes and continue to do very well. We were delighted to be asked to help and the whole experience has been very rewarding we hope the last 5 will soon find happy homes

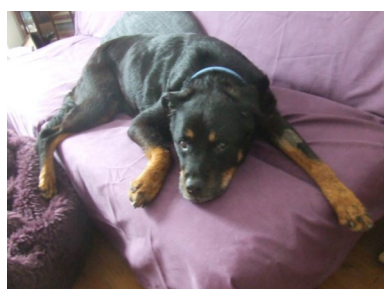
Faith one of the eight dogs! She is now very happy in her new home with her new little sister!

More and more cruelty cases are coming into Animal Care each year and its very sad that people can't ask for help and chose to treat animals in this way. Kittens and cats are being dumped at our gates on a weekly basis we are really struggling to find space to fit them all.

We hope that Bagpuss can soon find a new home and feel safe and happy.



Sadly not all the cats we try and help have a happy ending in the beginning of August 3 little kittens were left in a pillow case on the train tracks, thankfully a worker was on site and manage to save them from a horrific end! The kittens were fed and given lots of love by the staff but after a few day were rushed to the vets after suffering a horrible virus all 3 kittens were given as much care as possible but sadly no more could be done and all 3 died 4 days later. These kittens were only a few weeks old and did not even get a chance to experience life, It really is sad when animals are treated so badly.



This funny looking guy is Survivor the poor lad was found wondering the streets in such a state as soon as he arrived he was rushed to the vets, after a few hours of shaving all his mats off we could finely see the rabbits face! The poor thing must of felt horrible and very uncomfortable for such a long time. He now in the loving hand of Ann are main rabbit career where he is putting on weight and slowing getting over his ordeal!

We Need Your Help!



Last month Animal Care had 52 dogs looking for new homes a huge and worrying amount!! resorting to staff taking them home and dogs sleeping in the staff brew room!! thankfully 18 are on home trials or have been adopted leaving us with 34 wagging tails still waiting! and a huge list of dogs waiting for spaces! with so many dogs we are struggling to find enough food to feed them all! In a typical week we use 7 x 15kg bags of dry complete If you can donate any dry food (mixer/complete) we would be VERY grateful. As always thank you to all our supporters, volunteers and foster homes who have been helping us.



With a huge increase of dogs coming to Animal Care it has been our busiest year to date so many dogs need help either coming from the stray system or from homes it has been very difficult to manage, thankfully we have a very strong dedicated team of staff and volunteers which without Animal Care would no be able to excised.

On a day to day basis the staff have between 30/40 dogs to walk and spend time with so we are appealing for dog walkers and foster homes for our doggies. We like the younger, older, well behaved dogs to come into foster care when possible giving the staff time to train and work with the more difficult dogs on site.
